Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent. On Ash Wednesday, we aren't asked to cast stones at anyone else. We aren't asked to inflict wounds on our own hearts either. We simply acknowledge our own brokenness and humbly asks for forgiveness, which is the one prayer that is answered before it is even uttered.

Ash Wednesday reminds me of that silly game where a sticky note is stuck on your forehead with a famous person's name. You hear clues from other players and try to guess who you are. The ashes we place on our forehead are a note: God's loving mercy defines you. You aren't a consumer, a laborer, a genius or a failure. You are God's precious child with an eternal destiny. You have God's signature written in love across your forehead and your heart.

If you give up something for Lent, give up your "rock solid" belief that you have to prove that you are good enough. Give up judgmental, fearful, anxious thoughts about others. Give up worry and despair. Embrace love. Trust God's tender kindness. Look into the faces of others and look for ways to show her the mercy of God. Look for ways to affirm his worth in God's eyes.

Have you ever walked into the grocery store after an Ash Wednesday service and had someone stare at your forehead? Oops, I forgot! The smudge washes away but hopefully the realization lingers. God's compassion sticks. Hopefully, someone notices something new or changed about me. After all, she's broken too. He needs the mercy too. There's as much mercy as the earth has dust. It's all around. As Lent begins, try to embrace compassion for yourself and for others. Read Psalm 51 for some inspiration. "Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and sustain in me a willing spirit." 51:12 Be Blessed,


KROGER COMMUNITY REWARDS PROGRAM

On-Line Giving

More and more, the way we pay our bills is changing. Electronic payments are everywhere, from our monthly utility bills to on-line purchases. As a society, we are writing fewer and fewer checks. We are introducing two new convenient ways to allow members and friends make donations to Hope UCC.

On-Line – Visit the Hope UCC web site –<u>www.hopeuccmi.com</u>

Select "Give a Gift" tab on the home page

Select the "Give Here" button

Text - Using your cell phone text the word "Give" to 586-571-9003.

In both cases you will be directed to our secure payment processing center where you will be able to easily walk through the steps to register and make a donation. (Hint – if using the text method, save this phone number in your "Contacts" list to make it easier to access)

You will be able to make donations from your bank account or debit/credit card. The donation can be one time or recurring (weekly, every 2 weeks, 1st & 15th, monthly) to make it more convenient. You will have the ability to designate where your donation is going (Regular offering, Hope for the Future, etc.). Once you have set up a giving profile, you will be able to edit and change it at any time. You will receive email and text confirmation of your donation each time it is made. Your on-line donations will be recorded on your Annual Giving Statement from Hope UCC for tax reporting.

There is <u>no charge</u> for the on-line giving service. However, there are processing fees associated with each transaction that are deducted from the amount Hope receives. The fees are as follows:

Bank Account = \$.40 + .5% of donation Credit/Debit Card = \$.30 + 2.9% of donation.

Example = \$10 gift by bank account – fee is (\$.40 + \$.05) = \$.45 – Hope receives \$9.55 = \$10 gift by credit/debit card – fee is (\$.30 + \$.29) = \$.59 – Hope receives \$9.41

Your Giving Statement will reflect the total donation. You may consider increasing that donation to help offset the fees being charged.

HOPE PANTRY

Our Hope Pantry is always looking for a few good volunteers. Once a month you will have an opportunity to sign up and help our neighbors. On the day before our pantry, six volunteers are needed at 1:00 pm for about one and one half hours to unload and stock bread and produce. Then the rolling pantry shelves are put in place for Saturday, and we prepare the shopping bags. On Saturday, six volunteers are needed to shop with our clients, weigh the bags and help them to the cars. Helpers need to arrive by 9:50, and we should be closed up by 12:30. Please consider helping with this rewarding mission.

We, as a church, and each one of us individually, are blessed to be able to support our neighbors, and this mission returns so much to all of us. We hope that you have the opportunity to participate in this ongoing project, as we continue to grow HOPE as a pantry and an extension of our church. We will continue to need your support to keep the pantry stocked. Your donations of paper towels, toilet tissue, tooth paste, bar soap, shampoo, laundry, dish detergent, and feminine hygiene products are very helpful.

PANTRY UPDATE ~ FEBRUARY


