In December of 2021, the world lost a great spiritual leader with the death of Archbishop Desmond Tutu of South Africa. He was a powerful voice for justice and equality in the face of racial conflict in his home country. His life was a testament to faith, love, courage, and integrity in confronting one of the world's greatest problems and the source of conflict in human history.

We still struggle with painful issues regarding racism in this country. All you have to do is talk about #Black Lives Matter or try to have a discussion regarding educational programs about racism and people immediately experience tension and often conflict. We know that the issues of racial divide run deep.

When we study the scripture, we read that people who face struggles due to their economic situation, station in life, and racial identity are valued in our spiritual teachings just as much as those who enjoy a privileged status in society. In fact, they often hold a special place in our Judeo-Christian tradition. The story of the Exodus in the Hebrew scriptures, as well as several examples in the New Testament (see the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew), all point to the value and importance of caring for "the least of these" among us. It is important to note that the term "the least" does not assign importance, but it does recognize those whose challenges are greater than most people's struggles.

Archbishop Tutu once said that to choose neutrality in the face of injustice is to choose acceptance of it. In other words, it is never enough to simply stand by while injustice is evident. It is crucial to stand against it. That is what Archbishop Tutu did throughout his life, and he provides a powerful example and a lasting memory of this important truth.

What are the implications for the rest of us?

First of all, we are reminded that each of us carry responsibility for all of us. Living in blissful ignorance of the conditions of others is not a legitimate option if we seek to live an authentic life of love and concern. The ancient story of Cain and Able includes the question "Am I my brother's keeper?" Our faith would tell us the answer is Yes!

We know from the scripture and from observing life that we all benefit from a greater sense of community. We are better together. The value we place on one person impacts the welfare of all. As we remember the influence of Archbishop Tutu, may we give thanks for his life, but most importantly, may we learn from his example and seek to follow it.

You are welcome to have a cup of coffee and share some conversation.


