



An Easter Faith Building Activity for Families

Here is a baking/ Easter story idea that you can modify to make age appropriate for your child.

Materials List:

- · Bible
- Packages of crescent rolls
- Sugar
- · Cinnamon

- Large marshmallows cut in half
- · Cupcake liners
- Muffin tins

Sprinkle a little sugar into each child's hand. Let them taste it and sprinkle the rest onto the dough. Explain that the sweetest part of the Easter story is the love that God has for all people. John 3:16.

- Have the children sprinkle the dough with some cinnamon. Each child should place a $\frac{1}{2}$ marshmallow in the center of the dough and then fold the dough up around the marshmallow. Pinch the dough closed. Make sure that the dough is pinched close. Read John 19: 38-40 (Jesus' body is wrapped with spices).
- Put the rolls in the cupcake liners, pinched side down. Place the muffin tins in the oven. Read Matthew 27: 59-60 (Jesus is placed in the tomb).
- Give each child a piece of masking tape and seal the oven door. Explain that Jesus' tomb was sealed. Read Matt. 27:65-66. You could ask older children why they sealed the tomb (so that no one could steal the body).

When the rolls are done (and cooled a little) let each child have one. Ask them what they discovered. What do you think that means in relation to the story? Read Mark 16: 1-6 (the empty tomb).

Discussion together: Why was the tomb empty? What is the good news of Easter?



TEST KITS NEEDED

Please request these test kits. If you don't need all of them, please bring them to church for Pastor Meg to use as needed. She would very much like to have the ability to test herself before she does a visitation and even on Sunday mornings. She has been testing frequently on Sundays, because she takes her mask off to lead worship. Having additional tests would be a financial savings to her and would help to confirm that she is not an active carrier. Please bring to church on Sunday or drop off any unneeded test kits at the church office.



Did you sign up for the COVID at-home test kits through the Post Office?

These test may not be accurate if they are kept outside "normal" conditions; (68°F - 72°F / 20°C - 22°C and 30% - 50% relative humidity).


