~PERTINENT INFO~

If you are required to take an RMD (Required Minimum Distribution) from your IRA, you may want to consider doing your contributions to church by a QCD (Qualified Charitable Distribution) directly from your IRA account to Hope Church. The check from your IRA account needs to be made payable to Hope Church to qualify. The amount you do by QCD will not be taxable on your tax return. The check MUST clear the IRA account before the end of the year to qualify for a 2023 contribution. Therefore, it is recommended to do this by November 15th to be sure it clears. Be sure to tell your tax preparer about this transaction so it is recorded correctly on your tax return.

After you have the check sent, you should give the church a detailed listing of where the money should be applied (for example, how much to Weekly offerings, how much to Hope to the Future, how much to the Easter offering, how much to the Christmas offering, and all the other various envelopes in your box).

CHRISTIAN MISSION & WITNESS (cont.) Sustainable Grocery Shopping



There are many ways to be environmentally responsible when shopping for food. Here are a few tips:

Bring Reusable Shopping Bags

Americans use approximately 100 billion single-use plastic bags each year, which accumulate in landfills and waterways and never truly decompose. Some states have banned decomposable bags, but many still permit them. Come prepared to the grocery store with reusable bags to reduce the use of single-use plastics.

Shop the Perimeter

Food packaging and containers make up 23 percent of landfill waste. Shop around the perimeter of the store as much as possible to find the freshest, healthiest foods with the least amount of packaging, such as produce, bulk items, dairy, fresh fish, and meat. Bulk items like nuts, dry beans, coffee, tea, and grains can be purchased in exactly the amount needed with no packaging.

Plan Ahead

The average American wastes about 21 percent of the food they buy, which equates to about \$1,800 a year. To avoid overbuying and shrink the carbon footprint of multiple shopping trips, plan meals a week (or month) ahead and come with a shopping list organized by the sections or aisles of the store.

Shop Local and In Season

Local produce has a drastically smaller carbon footprint than fruits and vegetables that must travel long distances by truck, airplane, or ship. Buying local, in-season produce reduces waste because the produce is fresher when purchased and will not spoil as quickly at home. If the family's diet includes meat, choose pasture-raised, grass-fed products from farmers that practice regenerative organic agriculture, which improves the quality of the land and maintains local ecosystems.

Read Labels

Choose foods that were produced with the environment in mind, looking for the following labels, seals, and certifications.

- \Rightarrow USDA Organic
- ⇒ Biodynamic (BDA) for food produced without chemical pesticides or herbicides, using organic, non-GMO seeds
- \Rightarrow Non-GMO Project Verified for foods that were not genetically engineered
- ⇒ FAIRTRADE Mark and Fair Trade Certified for food producers committed to reasonable wages and the safe, fair treatment of workers
- \Rightarrow Climate Neutral Certified for food manufacturers committed to reducing their greenhouse gas emissions
- \Rightarrow Safe Catch for sustainably caught fish
- ⇒ Aquaculture Stewardship Council (ASC) and Best Aquaculture Practices (BAP) for sustainably farmed seafood





Hope United Church of Christ Synopsis of Board Meeting June 20, 2023

The meeting was called to order at 7:02 p.m. by President Steve Nielson. Pastor Meg led us in prayer.

Those in attendance: Pastor Meg Wilson, Steve Nielson, Rick Cole, Terri Hillman, Ida Eckert, Nancy Michelson, Lori Sarnowski, Linda Parsons, Jerry Rogers, Jim Wilson, and Linda Rehm.

Congregational Comments: Steve - None

Additions to the Agenda: None

Approval of Agenda: Motion: To approve the agenda as presented was made by Rick Cole with a second by Lori Sarnowski. Motion carried.

President's Remarks: Steve - He read a card of appreciation from Calley for the flowers received from the Board for Administrative Professional Day.

Approval of the June Meeting Minutes: Motion was made by Lori Sarnowski with a second by Ida Eckert to approve the June meeting minutes. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report Last Month: Motion was made by Linda Parsons with a second by Jim Wilson to approve the report. Motion Carried.

The following items summarize the financial results for the month of May:

- Statement of Operations Income (Page 3):
 - Weekly offerings for June 2023 were \$1,871 more than the amount budgeted and \$1,980 more than the amount received for June 2022. There were four Sundays in both years. Year to date Weekly Offerings were \$5,959 (\$213 per week) more than the same period in 2022. We also received Special Offerings of \$150 for Easter, \$100 for Energy, \$120 for Church Growth, and \$35 for Other – Father's Day. Year to date total Operating Income of \$110,161 is \$6,920 more than the same period in 2022.
 - The only Investment activity for the Operating Fund consisted of \$4.90 in interest to the Money Market Account.

Statement of Operations – Expense (Pages 4-6):

Total Expenses for June 2023 were \$2,287 less than the amount budgeted but \$1,262 more than the expense for June 2022. Year to date expenses were \$9,086 higher than the same period in 2022. There was a loss (Income less Expense) of \$2,697 for the month compared to a loss of \$4,260 for June of last year.

HR Update for Christian Education Director, Pastor Meg: The promising candidate mentioned at the June Board meeting had good references and seemed very interested in the position. Hopefully, she can start by August 1, 2023. She has wisdom, creativity, and understands social media. She will be working with Kristin and Jordan with the goal of reaching two age groups. This will be an incentive for families if there is more separation of ages and a Youth Group. Steve is excited about the prospect. Hopefully, she will be introduced at the next Board meeting.

First Review of the 2024 Budget: Terri: The board discussed the initial presentation. There will be a meeting by Pastor Meg, Terri, and Steve to go over it more closely, and it will again be presented to the Board next month with any of their suggestions in corporated. It has been suggested to have a Stewardship Campaign with a goal of raising a certain amount of money needed using a "Thermometer" to forecast where we are in our goal to have a balanced budget presented to the Congregation.

Photo Directory: Pastor Meg: The dates at Hope Church are October 17 and October 18, 2023. There is no cost to church members to have photos done. Pastoral Care: I continue to meet with people as needed for spiritual guidance and support. I am considering beginning a grief group. I am looking for a co-facilitator. A grief group works best if it has 10 participants. I have several weddings in the upcoming months, so I am doing the meetings required for wedding preparations. I did a funeral for a member of the community. Whenever possible, I try to meet the needs of families in crisis.

Church Business: Calley continues to update systems and find ways to make the office more efficient.

Spiritual Council: We will be promoting a new pictorial directory. The dates for photos are October 17th and 18th. I am thankful to Carol Troutman, who does a great job coordinating Coffee Hour. We have a family attending with a child who has a peanut allergy. We need to label all items with any nuts served at coffee hour.

Christian Education: We are having Sunday School for most weeks this summer. We are looking for volunteers to teach. We have 17 children attending this month's Camp Caring. I am planning a youth event for July 26th and then again on August 24th. The details are pending. I will be reaching out to potential Confirmands to begin the Confirmation Process for this year.

DMA & Conference Upcoming Involvement: The church and ministry committee meets during the summer months, but the DMA Linking Board does not.

Community Outreach: I am hosting an event for choir members and young/new members of the church at my home. The event is called Beers and Hymns and is led by Rev. Greg Larson. It is a family-friendly, casual evening to help build relationships with this portion of the congregation. If the event is a success, I will host another one and make it church-wide later in the summer.

The Operating Fund had a loss of \$14,485 for the first six months of 2023. This compares to a loss of \$12,319 for the first six months of 2022. Total Operating Income of \$110,161 was \$6,920 more than the same period last year. Total Operating Fund Expenses of \$124,646 were \$9,086 more than the same period last year.

Operating Fund Regular Offerings of \$101,510 were \$6,174 (\$237 per week) more than the same period of last year. In the first six months of 2023, we also received Special Offerings of \$1,285 for Easter, \$305 for Christmas, \$1,580 for Energy, \$75 for Other (primarily Mother's & Father's Days), and \$495 for Church Growth. Mission Offerings for the period included OCWM - \$530, One Great Hour of Sharing - \$495, and Christmas Fund - \$210.

In the first six months of 2023, the Building Fund had total Net Income of \$28,544. Hope for the Future (Regular) Offerings of \$8,475 were \$390 less than the amount received for the same period last year. 2023 Special Offerings of \$765 were \$1,660 less than the same period in 2022. There was a June 2023 year-to-date Investment Account gain of \$25,675 versus a loss of \$52,018 during the first half of 2022. Building Fund expenses were \$6,371 which was \$3,871 higher than the same period in 2022.

During the first half of 2023, Dedicated Accounts received \$18,136 (Good Samaritan \$615, Blessing Bags – Pets for Vets \$578, Senior Youth Group \$355, Food Pantry \$12,928, Special Gifts to Church School \$474, Ukraine Relief \$230, and Women of Hope \$2,956) and had expenses of \$6,712 (Good Samaritan \$857, Blessing Bags – Pets for Vets \$578, Senior Youth Group \$142, Food Pantry \$4,297, Special Gifts to Church School \$718, and Ukraine Relief \$120).
