"Do not be discouraged, for the LORD your God will be with you wherever you go."

Joshua 1:9


2023 Annual Reports Due!


Registration is required, so please sign up by contacting the church office.





Caring for your Poinsettia

- ~Keep the temperature consistent—between 60 and 68 F during the day and 10 degrees cooler at night.
- ~Group plants on water-filled trays full of pebbles to help increase humidity levels.
- ~Place near sunlight, but not in direct sunlight. Do not let a poinsettia touch cold window panes.
- ~Avoid drafts. The plants are sensitive to drafts and changes in temperature.
- ~Don't drown the roots. Wait until the soil surface dries out before watering. Best to remove the decorative foil wrapper or poke holes to allow for drainage.
- ~Cut back plants. Come mid-March, cut back by half to encourage new shoots. The plants also can be placed outside in the spring after the risk of frost has passed.
- ~Bring poinsettias back in mid-September to early October to force them to bloom again.

Home-DIY Giants Fail Boreal Forest in Canada

The country's two largest home-improvement chains are showing no love for some of the world's last intact primary forests. Home Depot and Lowe's have been under escalating pressure to report on the impact of their wood sourcing on primary forests in the Canadian boreal and to come up with specific plans to mitigate the resulting effects on climate, biodiversity, and human rights. Yet a recent report by Lowe's does little to change the status quo, and as for Home Depot-crickets. The company remains stubbornly silent even though nearly two-thirds of its shareholders passed a resolution last year demanding that it address its unsustainable wood-sourcing practices. "Lowe's made a small effort but still has miles to go," says Shelley Vinyard, NRDC

boreal corporate campaign manager. "Home Depot hasn't even bothered."

Home Depot's current sourcing policy dates all the way back to 1999 and fails to prevent sourcing from some of the world's most critical at-risk forest regions, including the old-growth forests of Canada's boreal. Home to hundreds of Indigenous communities and providing habitat for scores of wild-life species, the boreal forest in Canada also stores twice as much carbon as the world's oil reserves. "We'll continue to ratchet up the pressure on companies like Home Depot and Lowe's to take meaningful, measurable action to eliminate the destruction and degradation of these irreplaceable forests in their supply chains," says Vinyard.

To help reduce the nearly 43 percent of people who are food insecure in southeast Michigan, **Focus: HOPE** is increasing its effort to expand the monthly food program for seniors. Unlike many food programs that provide

one-time meals, this program focuses on supplementing senior pantries with items like milk, cereal, and canned goods that can be used throughout the entire month.




