## GROUPS AND MEETINGS









#### Hope United Church of Christ Synopsis of Board Meeting April 9, 2024

The meeting was called to order at 7:09 p.m. by President Steve Neilson. Pastor Meg led us in prayer.

<u>Those in attendance: Pastor Meg, Steve Nielson, Nancy Burnham, Terri Hillman, Nancy Fay,</u> Lori Sarnowski, Jerry Rogers, Kirk Schoenherr. Absent: Linda Parsons and Linda Rehm.

Congregational Comments - Steve. None

Additions to the Agenda – Steve/Pastor Meg added staffing issues. This will come under new business.

Approval of Agenda – Motion to approve the agenda as presented was made by Nancy Burnham with a second by Lori Sarnowski. Motion carried.

President's Remarks – Steve. The Lenten/Easter season was informational, loving and a caring set of services. He was able to attend most of them and Pastor Meg did a great job with this Easter season.

Approval of the March Meeting Minutes – Motion by Kirk Schoenherr with a second by jerry Rogers to approve the March minutes. Motion Carried.

Treasurer's Report March – Motion by Kirk Schoenherr with a second by Jerry Rogers to approve the March minutes. Motion Carried.

Re: Financial Report for March 2024

The following items summarize the financial results for the month of March:

Statement of Operations – Income:

• Weekly Offerings for March 2024 were \$1,041 less than the amount budgeted and \$476 less than the amount received for March 2023. There were four Sundays in 2023 but five Sundays in 2024. Year to date Weekly Offerings were \$1,783 less than the amount budgeted but \$794 (\$57 per week) more than the same period in 2023. We also received Special Offerings in the amount of \$1,645 for Easter, \$160 for Energy, \$150 for Our Church's Wider Mission, and \$640 for One Great Hour of Sharing.

The only Investment activity for the Operating Fund consisted of \$3.00 in interest to the Money Market Account. Year to date Operating Income is \$1,329 less than the amount budgeted but \$2,489 more than 2023.

Statement of Operations – Expense:

In keeping with direction approved at the Annual Meeting in February, \$79,238 was transferred from the bank Savings account to the Money Market fund in the Charles Schwab investment account in March. Those funds appear in the financial reports as offsetting expense in the Operating Fund and income in the Building Fund. Total Operating Fund Expenses for March 2024, excluding the effect of the transfer, were \$2,194 less than the amount budgeted and \$5,598 less than the Expenses for March 2023. The variance in March Expense year over year was mainly driven by a large Grounds Upkeep payment for salt and snow removal in 2023 and a \$2,208 refund for Workers' Compensation in 2024.

Year to date Expenses, adjusted for the funds transfer, were \$3,189 less than budgeted and \$958 less than the same period in 2023.

There was a loss (Income less Expense) of \$1,958 in March 2024 versus a loss of \$9,233 in March 2023.

Dedicated Accounts:

Dedicated Accounts had income of \$981 and expense of \$1,223 for the month, leaving a balance of \$95,702.

Building Fund:

Hope for the Future offerings received in March 2024 were \$200 more than the amount budgeted and \$135 more than the amount received for March 2023. We have received Memorials of \$990 year to date.

Investments:

The securities account, adjusted for the funds transfer, had a March gain of \$7,483 compared to a gain of \$5,942 for March 2023. Year to date 2024 the Securities account has a gain of \$18,829 versus a gain of \$14,079 for the 2023.

#### **New Business**

**Motor City Chorale** – Steve said this group is coming on Sunday, April 14, 2024 at 3 p.m. Pastor Meg will do a robo call to remind our members and also announce it on Sunday morning.

**Jimmy Johns Game** – Nancy mention Jessica Hazelton and Todd Eckert are heading of this event. The tickets will go on sale soon at church and are \$15. each. See Jessica or Todd if you are interested in going.

**Review of Lent and Easter** – Pastor Meg said next year Ash Wednesday is on March 5<sup>th</sup> so we won't be having a Valentine/Ash Wednesday dinner. The Lenten series may be in person and on line. We had a great team in place this year and involved a lot of new people. Kyle McKuen hung the fabric on the cross for Good Friday and changed it for Easter.

It was great to see so many people in the pews on Palm Sunday and Easter, lots of kids on Sunday.

**DMA Grants** – Pastor Meg mention she applied for 2 grants from the DMA. The grants are available from \$250. to \$1,000. The funds are for missions or social justice use. One grant will be for Camp Caring. The second one some of the older youth expressed an interest in a small garden.

**June 11<sup>th</sup> Board Meeting** – Steve would like all Board members to try to attend. We will meet at 6 p.m. for a light dinner and our meeting at 7 p.m. Terri Hillman also stated she will have a first draft of the budget and is asking all committee chairs to watch for her email for information for budget needs for next year. Steve added that we may have the results of the "Be The Church" survey.

**Parking Lot Update** - Steve stated the Board has received emails indicating the latest update for the work to begin. The Township Civil Engineer has redrawn the plans to get around the gas lines on the property. They were being delivered to Hutch on April 9<sup>th</sup>. The new plans indicate pipes will be closer to the wall between

the church and Kaul Funeral Home. Norm Nenninger indicated there will be some changes in the construction but they will be minor. The roof drains will need to be longer but it is not a bigger expense. The work will be delayed until the end of April. The Township people, Hutch and the church meet this past Friday and discussed the issue and there will not be a big delay. Nancy Fay asked for the construction people to be aware of Pantry Day and other church functions. **Staffing Issues** – Pastor Meg stated the potential candidate for the CEC position has fallen through. Nancy Burnham will repost the job on Indeed.

Calley, our Admin has resigned effective immediately for personal reasons. Pastor Meg will reach out to her and ask for her assistance in getting in to the computer for ordering supplies and various items needed for the work she has done. We wish her well and will honor her resignation. HR will also meet to discuss and repost her job on Indeed.

#### Pastor's Report - Pastor Meg:

**Worship: :** I will write a review of Lent and Holy Week as a separate document. I have started a sermon series that we will use for the next few weeks leading up to Pentecost. We have been saying the Apostles Creed on the first Sunday of the month. I will also be introducing other creeds that are recognized by the UCC. We are also incorporating worship music with both traditional and more contemporary styles.

**Pastoral Care:** The grief group finished its study. This group will meet once in April for a wrap up meeting. I meet with individuals in need of support during difficult times.

Church Business: Holy Week is a very intense time for the church office.

**Spiritual Council:** We submitted the approval of the proof book so we should receive the final book in the next few weeks. There is a new member class that will be offered on April 26<sup>th</sup> and May 5<sup>th</sup>. The Lenten Book Study meet on zoom. I also hope to offer a spring book study in April based on the book <u>Accidental Saints</u> by Rev. Nadia Bolz-Weber. This study will be offered both in person and via zoom on Wednesday evenings at 7pm and Thursdays at 10:30 in person beginning April 18<sup>th</sup>.

**Pastor Relations:** This group met in February. We will meet again this spring. The purpose of the committee is to help strength the relationship with the congregation and the pastor. The committee also serves as a sounding board for the pastor.

**Christian Education**: Confirmation classes are meeting regularly. Palm Sunday was a very family friendly event. We are still looking for a CEC Director.

**DMA & Conference Upcoming Involvement:** Rev. Dr. Diane Baker and I co-chair the Committee on Ministry. The DMA Spring Meeting will be on April 20<sup>th</sup>. This will be a hybrid meeting. The ordination of Dr. Selma Massey is scheduled for May 19<sup>th</sup> at GPCC.

**Community Outreach:** We continue to see visitors with some frequency. We need to make a deliberate effort to welcome visitors at coffee hour.

Other notes: The new picture directory should be out soon; a new member class and book study will be starting soon. Focus is to fill Calley's position as soon as possible. The new sermon series is going well.

Consent Agenda Items – Steve. received reports from the Spiritual Council, Pastoral Relations and the Property Committee.

Motion was made by Nancy Burnham with a second by Kirk Schoenherr to accept these reports as submitted. Motion carried.

#### Three Month Financial Summary

A summary of the 2024 financial results for January through March follows:

The Operating Fund had a loss of \$7,310 for the first three months of 2024. This compares to a loss of \$10,757 for the first three months of 2023. Total Operating Income of \$56,749 was \$2,489 more than the same period last year. Total Operating Fund Expenses of \$64,059 (adjusted for interfund transfer) were \$958 less than the same period last year.

Operating Fund Regular Offerings of \$50,933 were \$846 (\$65 per week) more than the same period of last year. In the first three months of 2024, we also received Special Offerings of \$1,645 for Easter, \$10 for Christmas, and \$730 for Energy. Mission Offerings for the period included OCWM - \$490, One Great Hour of Sharing - \$640, and Christmas Fund - \$10.

In the first quarter of 2024, the Building Fund had total Income (adjusted for interfund transfer) of \$23,424. Hope for the Future (Regular) Offerings of \$3,605 were \$680 less than the amount received for the same period last year. 2024 Special Offerings of \$990 were \$325 more than the same period in 2023. There was a March 2024 year-to-date Investment account gain of \$18,829 versus a gain of \$14,079 during the first three months of 2023. Building Fund expenses were zero which was \$5,596 lower than the same period in 2023 when Engineering and Township fees were paid to begin the parking lot repair project.

During the first three months of 2024, Dedicated Accounts received \$2,369 (CMWC Projects \$1,108, Food Pantry \$1,111, Special Gifts to Church School \$50, and Ukraine Relief \$100) and had expenses of \$3,162 (Good Samaritan \$155, Food Pantry \$1,910, Special Gifts to Church School \$850, Ukraine Relief \$100, and Misc Temporary Items \$147).

\* NOTE: In keeping with direction approved at Hope UCC's February 2024 Annual Meeting, a transfer of \$79,238 was made in March from the First State Bank Savings account to the Money Market fund in the Charles Schwab Investment account. Those funds appear in the financial statements as offsetting Expense in the Operating Fund and Income in the Building Fund (Interfund Transfers). The analysis above excludes those entries so that reasonable comparisons can be made to 2023 figures.
