WORDS OF HOPE

And now these three remain: faith, hope, and love. But the greatest of these is love. - 1 Corinthians 13:13 (NIV)

It is the season of weddings and anniversaries. June has always been a popular wedding month. The scripture most often read at a wedding is from 1 Corinthians chapter 13. I've often found the last verse puzzling. Why does Paul say the greatest is love? Love is pretty awesome, of course, but greater than faith and hope?

Faith is the heart of Christian belief. "For by grace you have been saved through faith," the apostle wrote in his letter to the Ephesians. What can be more important than faith? And what about hope? How does anyone live a day without at least a glimmer of hope? I'm not sure I would have dared to rank faith, hope, and love as Paul did. It's rather like ranking air, food, and water.

Then again, maybe the Holy Spirit's on to something here. Why? Because when you can't keep faith and you can't hold hope, you can always see love.

Many times I need this reminder. When I sit with parents to plan the funeral for their baby. When I hear of the rise of people who don't see the value of church, I begin to wonder about the future of the church. When I see extreme poverty. When I watch the coverage of the war between Israel and Palestine and see the devastation of innocent families. When hatred and injustice seem to have the upper hand, my heart sinks.

Sometimes when I have a hard time with faith or hope, I can hang on to the love shown to me, especially with the knowledge that "nothing can separate me from the love of God" (*Romans 8*). When others struggle to have faith and when they feel like hope is in short supply, I am reminded that I need to be the love they can see. Where in your life are you able to be the love others see?

I think Paul was right. Love is the greatest. Here at Hope Church, we strive to be a community where love is spoken, and hope abounds. Will you join with us in sharing God's love?

Prayer: Lord, help me notice those who need an encouraging message. Who can I show that your love never fails? Amen. Blessings, Pastor Meg

GROUPS AND MEETINGS





Hope United Church of Christ Synopsis of Board Meeting May 14, 2024

The meeting was called to order at 7:02 p.m. by President Steve Nielson. Pastor Meg led us in prayer.

Those in attendance: Pastor Meg, Steve Nielson, Nancy Burnham, Terri Hillman, Nancy Fay, Lori Sarnowski, Jerry Rogers, Kirk Schoenherr, Linda Parsons and Linda Rehm.

Congregational Comments - Steve - None

Additions to the Agenda – Steve – There will be the deletion of the Jimmy Johns Field Baseball game update under "New Business" until the June meeting since there is still another week of ticket sales on Sunday, May 19, 2024. This update will be tabled until the June meeting.

Approval of Agenda – Motion to approve the agenda as presented was made by Linda Rehm with a second by Lori Sarnowski. Motion carried.

President's Remarks – Steve – A reminder that the June Board Meeting will be held in person on Tuesday, June 11, 2024. The two main topics at the June Board Meeting will be a presentation of the survey results by Tony and Kurt on "How to be the Church" as well as the first draft of the 2025 budget.

Approval of the April Meeting Minutes – Motion by Nancy Burnham with a second by Linda Parsons to approve the April minutes. Motion Carried.

Treasurer's Reports for April 2024 – Motion was made by Nancy Burnham with a second by Nancy Fay to approve the report for April. Motion Carried.

The following items summarize the financial results for the month of April:

Statement of Operations – Income (Page 3):

Weekly Offerings for April 2024 were \$3,418 less than the amount budgeted and \$9,113 less than the amount received for April 2023. There were five Sundays in 2023, including Easter, but four Sundays in 2024 without Easter which occurred in March this year. Year to date Weekly Offerings were \$5,200 less than the amount budgeted and \$8,319 (\$438 per week) less than the same period in 2023. We also received Special Offerings in the amount of \$87 for Easter, \$435 for Energy, and \$95 for One Great Hour of Sharing.

The only Investment activity for the Operating Fund consisted of \$0.44 in interest to the Money Market Account.

Year to date Operating Income is \$4,306 less than the amount budgeted and \$7,661 less than 2023.

Statement of Operations – Expense (Pages 4-6):

Total Operating Fund Expenses for April 2024 were \$2,418 less than the amount budgeted and \$1,102 less than the Expenses for April 2023. Year to date Expenses were \$5,607 less than budgeted and \$2,060 less than the same period in 2023. Year to date favorability is primarily driven by open staff positions, a Workers' Comp refund, and lower heating cost, partially offset by higher administrative expenses.

There was a loss (Income less Expense) of \$2,830 in April 2024 versus a gain of \$6,218 in April 2023.

Dedicated Accounts (Page 7):

Dedicated Accounts had income of \$1,732 and expense of \$4,184 for the month, leaving a balance of \$93,250.

Building Fund (Page 9):

Hope for the Future offerings received in April 2024 were \$1,150 which was \$425 less than the amount budgeted and \$175 less than the amount received for April 2023. We have received Memorials of \$990 year to date.

Invcuestments (Page 9):

The securities account had an April loss of \$8,463 compared to a gain of \$2,741 for April 2023. Year to date 2024, the Securities account, adjusted for the interfund transfer*, has a gain of \$10,366 versus a gain of \$16,821 for the 2023.

* **NOTE:** In keeping with direction approved at the Annual Meeting in February, \$79,238 was transferred from the bank Savings account to the Money Market fund in the Charles Schwab investment account in March. Those funds appear In the financial reports as year to date offsetting expense in the Operating Fund and income in the Building Fund and are excluded from this analysis so that reasonable comparisons can be made to 2023 figures.

Terri Hillman also mentioned that perhaps we might need to send a letter or email to the Congregation reminding them that they had approved the Budget and they need to continue to support Hope with their contributions. A discussion followed.

New Business

New Office Computer – Jim Wilson: We have needed a new office computer for some time. Jim has spent some time cleaning up the current computer, which is about five years old. We are also leaving the computer on now to prevent having to wait five to ten minutes for it to boot up. Jim has researched the cost of a new computer a and a replacement should cost from \$1200.00 to \$1400.00 and serve us well for four to five years. After some discussion, the Board felt we should allow enough money to be spent to get all the features, programs, speed and space the church might need on a new computer. The new computer will be purchased from money in the Endowment Fund (a dedicated account) which currently has funds from the McCornack Trust that has no restrictions on how to spend the funds.

Nancy Burnham made the motion to spend up to \$2,000.00 for a new office computer to be funded from the Endowment Fund. A second to the motion was made by Nancy Fay. Motion carried.

Parking Lot Update – Steve: The work on the parking lot was supposed to begin on Monday, May 13th but due to the delay caused by a new Engineering Plan to work with the location of the existing utility supply lines, Hutch Paving started another project in Oxford. This new project also ran into gas main issues. The new plan by Civil Engineering for our parking lot resulted in an additional bill of \$1,230.00 which has already been paid. The revised plans will require more/different materials in the sewer line and will result in a cost increase from the original contract. The additional costs by Hutch Paving should not exceed \$5,000.00 which will still bring the total cost to below the amount approved by the Congregation of \$135,000.00.

Hutch Paving now plans to start Phase 1 of our parking lot project on Wednesday or Thursday of this week with the drain pipes and this portion should be done by May 22, 2024. They will then move to the Parking Lot Portion of the project or Phase 2. They expect 100% completion by May 31st. Clinton Township will make sure all the plans are followed.

The Investment Committee will need to get the funds available possibly by the end of the month but per the contract we have 15 days to pay after receiving the final invoice from Hutch Paving. This should give the Investment Committee plenty of time to transfer the funds to our First State account.

Administrative Assistant Update – Nancy Burnham: We processed 300 resumes which we narrowed down to two applicants. HR recommended Gail Fellman and sent an email to the Board Members on May 8^{th} prior to this Board Meeting to secure the position. Her most recent work experience has been with the hotel industry in management. She is very familiar with Microsoft office, other software programs and social media. During this Board Meeting the motion was made to hire Gail Fellman as our new Administrative Assistant by Linda Rehm with a second by Linda Parsons. Motion carried. Pastor Meg selected June 2^{nd} as the date to introduce her to the church congregation.

Church Directory Update – Pastor Meg: Not overly thrilled with them. Pictures and names don't always match. A CD did come with the order. Will try to get remaining directories distributed through family members if possible or as last resort – by mail. Then will see if there are extra copies available for those who did not have a photo taken but have requested a directory.

Laity Sunday – Pastor Meg: Suggests October 20th or October 27th. She would be there but Laity would run service. Motion was made to have Hope Church have a Laity Service in late October 2024 by Nancy Fay with a second by Nancy Burnham. Motion carried.

Welcoming Committee Update – Nancy Burnham: Committee is Nancy Burnham, Cindy Johnson, Jan Nenninger and Jane White. This coming Sunday for Pentecost it is Birthday Party for Coffee Hour. The Committee would like to see more people get involved with these monthly events. They would like to just supervise but not do all the work Various people have mentioned to Pastor Meg that they do not always feel welcomed at coffee hour. For Pentecost Sunday we will mix up seating. We want everyone to feel welcome.

Pastor's Report - Pastor Meg:

Worship: We are finishing our series on Resurrection Stories on Pentecost Sunday. Our Pentecost Celebration will be full of spirit! We will celebrate the baptism of Lou Childers and receive him as a new member. We celebrated the Baptism of Isabel Neill on 4/28 and Hazel Patyk was baptized in a private service on 5/5. On 5/26 we will baptize Melanie and McKenzie Blankenbeckler, daughters of Tara and Jeremy.

Pastoral Care: The grief group met once in April for a wrap up meeting. I meet with individuals in need of support during difficult times.

Church Business: It has been very difficult not having an Administrative Assistant. Gail started on Monday 5/13. She will be introduced to the congregation on June 2nd. We have been cleaning up files to update the office records. **Spiritual Council:** We received the photo directory. We finished the spring book study <u>Accidental Saints</u> by Rev. Nadia Bolz-Weber. I'm considering doing a summer book study at a coffee shop during August. Spiritual council will meet in June. Pastor Relations: This group will meet in June. met in February.

Christian Education: Confirmation classes are meeting regularly. We are still looking for a CEC Director. The children will be involved in Pentecost worship. Camp Caring will be held once in July on 7/24 and once in August on 8/13.

DMA & Conference Upcoming Involvement: The ordination of Dr. Selma Massey is scheduled for May 19th at GPCC. Nancy Fay was elected by the DMA to serve on the Committee on Ministry. Hope Church has been awarded 2 grants from the DMA: one for a small vegetable garden and one to help with Camp Caring expenses. **Community Outreach:** We continue to see visitors with some frequency. We need to make a deliberate effort to welcome visitors at coffee hour.

Consent Agenda Items – Steve <u>received reports from Christian Mission and Witness Committee for March and for</u> April, the Property Committee and the HR Committee. Motion was made by Nancy Burnham with a second by Lori Sarnowski to accept these reports as submitted. Motion carried.

These items are not for discussion. They are for review purposes only. Board will accept them as presented. If, however discussion is needed, a trustee can make a motion to remove them from the consent agenda for further discussion.
