Words of Hope

You are the light of the world—like a city on a hilltop that cannot be hidden... let your good deeds shine out for all to see, so that everyone will praise your heavenly Father. (Matthew 7: 14, 16).

Fireflies, also known as lightning bugs, are in the family of winged beetles and are known for their use of bioluminescence to attract mates or prey. August evenings in Michigan are lit up with the dance of the firefly!

Since their lights are easily observed after dark when I was little, my friends and I spent many evenings running through the yard scooping up these tiny creatures. We then placed them in our ready-made mason jars, complete with a few holes in the lid and grass inside. I would place the jar in my bedroom and pretend it was a nightlight. But if the firefly was not released shortly, they and their light would die.

All types of light have a purpose. Historically fireplaces provided light, heat, and a place for cooking, oil lamps illuminated dark rooms for reading, streetlights gave light for travelers, and finally electricity made it possible for light to appear with the flip of a switch.

Fireflies have a purpose for lighting up, and according to Jesus so do we. Hypocrisy (pretending to be something I am not) and legalism (paying more attention to the letter of the law than the spirit), and unhealthy choices will dim my light. Loving everyone unconditionally, accepting others and being hospitable allows our light to radiate a warm glow. When it does, others will be attracted to the Christ we serve.

Unfortunately, not everyone will be drawn to our lights even when we let them shine effectively. We are not responsible for others' response; we only can control our own light. So, let God fuel your light so it shines vibrantly! When you see the dance of the firefly let it serve as a prayer reminding you to act in a way that allows others to see your light and perhaps, they will praise God too!




This gathering is open to all in our community. We would ask that all church members planning to attend sign up in the lobby so we can begin to have a head count.

BE THE CHURCH SURVEY RESULTS

During the spring the church participated a survey based on the United Church of Christ statement about how to Be the Church. We were looking for input about new ways to empower our members to actively be the church. The Board of Trustees is committed to finding ways to live out this mission. We are beginning with our community meals on Wednesdays in August. We wanted to share the most popular responses from the congregation.

For each survey topic the responses are listed in order starting with the most popular responses. Any comments that were given are listed as well.

- 1. Reject Racism
- -Invite Guest speakers to share their experiences and perspectives
- -Develop a relationship with an UCC African American Church



- 2. Protect the Environment
- -Organize community clean-up events in local parks and waterways (wear vest/shirts saying Hope Church)
- -Implement sustainable practices within the church, such as recycling programs and energy-efficient lighting (maps to recycle centers/plant bee/butterfly garden)
- -Advocate for environmental policies at the local and nations levels, engage in letter writing campaigns and rallies
- 3. Share Earthly and Spiritual Resources
- -Explore creating a community garden
- -Host community meals to benefit those who need food and socialization opportunities



- 4. Embrace Diversity
- -Participate in local interfaith events
- -Explore becoming an official Open and Affirming congregation
- -Host cultural events and celebrations to honor the diversity within our congregation and community

The Operating Fund had a loss of \$8,468 for the first six months of 2024. This compares to a loss of \$14,485 for the first six months of 2023. Total Operating Income of \$112,169 was \$2,009 more than the same period last year. Total Operating Fund Expenses of \$120,637 (adjusted for interfund transfer) were \$4,009 less than the same period last year.

Operating Fund Regular Offerings of \$102,350 were \$841 (\$28 per week) more than the same period of last year. In the first six months of 2024, we also received Special Offerings of \$1,732 for Easter, \$10 for Christmas, \$1,425 for Energy, \$630 for Church Growth and \$115 in Other Offerings. Mission Offerings for the period included OCWM - \$490, One Great Hour of Sharing - \$735, and Christmas Fund - \$10.

In the first quarter of 2024, the Building Fund had total Income (adjusted for interfund transfer) of \$39,883. Hope for the Future (Regular) Offerings of \$8,574 were \$99 more than the amount received for the same period last year. 2024 Special Offerings of \$4,685 were \$3,920 more than the same period in 2023. There was a March 2024 year-to-date Investment account gain of \$26,624 versus a gain of \$25,676 during the first six months of 2023. Building Fund expenses were \$2,870 which was \$3,501 lower than the same period in 2023 when Engineering and Township fees were paid to begin the parking lot repair project.

During the first six months of 2024, Dedicated Accounts received \$7,116 (Good Samaritan \$425, Blessing Bags – Covenant House \$760, CMWC Projects \$2,172, Food Pantry \$2,267, Special Gifts to Church School \$150, Ukraine Relief \$200, UCC Assoc Grants \$500 and a \$642 transfer to combine Endowment Funds) and had expenses of \$10,817 (Good Samaritan \$607, Blessing Bags – Covenant House \$760, Food Pantry \$5,475, Special Gifts to Church School \$1,050, Ukraine Relief \$200, and Endowment Funds transfer to combine line items plus purchase of new office computer \$2,725).

* NOTE: In keeping with direction approved at Hope UCC's February 2024 Annual Meeting, a transfer of \$79,238 was made in March from the First State Bank Savings account to the Money Market fund in the Charles Schwab Investment account. Those funds appear in the financial statements as offsetting Expense in the Operating Fund and Income in the Building Fund (Interfund Transfers). The analysis above excludes those entries so that reasonable comparisons can be made to 2023 figures.

Hope United Church of Christ Synopsis of Board Meeting July 9, 2024

The meeting was called to order at 7:09 p.m. by President Steve Nielson. Pastor Meg led us in prayer.

Those in attendance: Pastor Meg, Steve Nielson, Nancy Burnham, Terri Hillman, Lori Sarnowski, Kirk Schoenherr, Linda Parsons, Linda Rehm and Nancy Fay. Absent: Jerry Rogers. Guest: Jim Wilson to give Computer Update.

Congregational Comments - Steve - None

Additions to the Agenda – Steve – Computer Update by guest, Jim Wilson

Approval of Agenda – Motion to approve the agenda as amended was made by Linda Parsons with a second by Nancy Fay. Motion carried.

President's Remarks – Steve: He informed Board he will be out of town from August 2nd to August 14, 2024. Nancy Burnham will fill in for him at the Board Meeting on August 13, 2024.

Approval of the June Meeting Minutes – Motion by Kirk Schoenherr with a second by Nancy Burnham to approve the June minutes. Motion Carried.

Treasurer's Report for June 2024 – Motion was made by Linda Parsons with a second by Nancy Burnham to approve the report for June. Motion Carried.

The following items summarize the financial results for the month of June:

Statement of Operations - Income (Page 3):

- Weekly Offerings for June 2024 were \$9,427 more than the amount budgeted and \$9,556 more than the amount received for June 2023. There were five Sundays in 2024 but only four Sundays 2023. Year to date Weekly Offerings were \$471 less than the amount budgeted but \$812 (\$28 per week) more than the same period in 2023. We also received Special Offerings of \$210 for Energy and \$120 for Church Growth.
- The only Investment activity for the Operating Fund consisted of \$0.38 in interest to the Money Market Account.
- Year to date Operating Income, comprised of Weekly Offerings plus other Income accounts, is \$980 more than the amount budgeted and \$2,009 more than 2023.

Statement of Operations – Expense (Pages 4-6):

- Total Operating Fund Expenses for June 2024 were \$381 less than the amount budgeted but \$1,754 more than the
 Expenses for June 2023. Year to date Expenses were \$7,165 less than budgeted and \$4,009 less than the same period
 in 2023. Year to date favorability to Expense budget is primarily driven by open staff positions, a Workers' Comp refund,
 and lower heating cost, partially offset by higher electricity, office supplies, and administrative expenses.
- There was Income (Income less Expense) of \$5,288 in June 2024 versus a loss of \$2,697 in June 2023.

Dedicated Accounts (Page 7):

Dedicated Accounts had income of \$1,569 and expense of \$531 for the month, leaving a balance of \$92,794.

Building Fund (Page 9):

 Hope for the Future offerings received in June 2024 were \$6,154 which was \$5,104 more than the amount budgeted and \$4,404 more than the amount received for June 2023. We have received Memorials of \$1,485 year to date.

Investments (Page 9):

 The securities account had a June gain of \$5,535 compared to a gain of \$9,919 for June 2023. Year to date 2024, the Securities account, adjusted for the interfund transfer*, has a gain of \$26,624 versus a gain of \$25,676 for the 2023.

Nancy Burnham and Cindy Johnson will help with the meals.

The other item from survey to be started soon will be the Community Garden. A spot has been selected and the Grant money has been received. We will at least get the ground tilled now. Not sure if anything will be planted this summer or if we will wait till next year to actually plant.

Board Sponsored Hot Dog Picnic/Coffee Hour – Steve: Sunday, July 21, 2024. Pastor Meg will not be in attendance. Nancy Burnham will get the food purchased. There will be hot dogs, veggie dogs, bags of chips, lemonade, bottled water, iced tea and ice cream sandwiches. Condiments for the hot dogs. Nancy Fay, Linda Parsons and Terri Hillman will help with set up. Linda Rehm and Kirk Schoenherr will assist with cleanup. Lori Sarnowski will help if she can. Steve Nielson will do the grilling and get others to help as needed.

Parking Lot and Grounds Update – Steve: Hopefully this will be the last update. Parking lot is done. All lines painted, etc. Norm has been out during rains and very pleased with how the water drains, runs down side of building and to the basin. Working just the way it is supposed to. A couple of the sprinkler lines were broken. USA Sprinkler Service came out and repaired. The sprinkler system is up and running. Brandon from Hutch Paving said the cost of repairs would be covered by them or the Excavation Company. We have only received the normal sprinkler startup bill from USA Sprinkler Service. Hutch Paving directly contacted USA telling them to invoice Hutch Paving for the repair cost. They have pulled up the black plastic and filled in gravel ditch. Regraded and sprayed new grass-seed and it is starting to look green. Norm had one little concern regarding flat drain where water goes in at concave sewer and there could be some erosion. If any issue, Brandon will take care of it and repair it. It is part of our guarantee. The next thing we should hear about the parking lot will be from Terri that the final invoice has been paid. Linda Parsons, who is part of the Investment Committee, confirmed that there is plenty of time to get the money together to pay Hutch Paving timely from when we actually receive the final invoice.

Adopt a Flower – Pastor Meg: The flower beds in front of the church need some weeding. Also, some dirt needs to be laid near the storage shed and plant some hostas. She suggested we reach out to Karen McCuen who is a Master Gardener and see what she suggests. Norm did some spraying of weeds. We might encourage a worknight to remulch. Nancy Fay suggested we contact a Boy Scout troop to lift bags of mulch and spread mulch. There would be a cost per bag of mulch.

In addition to the Pastor's Report which follows, Pastor Meg mentioned that Gail is doing great with the new program "Canva". She is creating great things. The July Beacon was done on this new program.
