The bell rings. Pencils are sharpened to a perfect point and the smell of new school supplies is in the air. Bulletin boards are fresh and desks are clean. Teachers greet students and welcome them to the 2024/2025 school year. Many of the students will be

struggling, carrying issues as heavy as their backpacks. Their teachers will work long after the school day ends trying to maneuver through all the school systems' requirements. **People of faith have an opportunity.**

Many children come to school from complicated home environments. Teachers see children carrying stress and anxiety around safety concerns that impact

both the kids and teachers. People of faith have an opportunity.

Students respond to love, a word of encouragement, and an opportunity to share their ideas. Teachers also respond to love. One of the greatest displays of love is through the act of service. When love is acted out, without an agenda, humanity is positively impacted. **People of faith have an opportunity.**

- *Ask a teacher if she/he needs help prepping materials.
- *Donate to the food pantry to help families who need emergency meals between paychecks.
- *Go to a school game or concert to support the kids, coaches, and teachers.
- *Drop off donuts or fruit at the school's main office sometime during the year.
- * Drop off inexpensive gloves for the kids who show up without any.
- *Pray for specific students and teachers.
- *Write a note of encouragement to a teacher.

Some of these ideas are simpler than others. This list is just the beginning. It gives ideas of a few ways to share the "good news." For our schools to thrive, they need to experience tangible expressions of love. **People of faith have an opportunity to offer God's love to students and educators. Our prayers and actions will help bring love to the head of the class.**

We can help!



August Update for Camp Caring




This was our second Camp Caring for the summer! The day began with acting out the story of the Good Samaritan and discussing how we too can be good Samaritans.



Hope United Church of Christ Synopsis of Board Meeting August 13, 2024

The meeting was called to order at 7:17 p.m. by Vice-President Nancy Burnham. Pastor Meg led us in prayer.

Those in attendance: Pastor Meg, Nancy Burnham, Terri Hillman, Kirk Schoenherr, Linda Parsons, Linda Rehm, Jerry Rogers and Nancy Fay. Absent: Steve Nielson and Lori Sarnowski.

Congregational Comments – Nancy Burnham – None

Additions to the Agenda – Nancy Burnham – Under new Business add gas grill not working.

Approval of Agenda – Motion to approve the agenda as amended was made by Nancy Fay with a second by Kirk Schoenherr. Motion carried.

President's Remarks – Nancy Burnham: Just filling in for Steve.

Approval of the July Meeting Minutes – Motion by Linda Rehm with a second by Jerry Rogers to approve the July minutes. Motion Carried.

Treasurer's Report for July 2024 – Motion was made by Linda Parsons with a second by Kirk Schoenherr to approve the report for July. Motion Carried.

Terri Hillman also reported that we have continued with increase in income. We have righted ourselves. She also reported that the parking lot repair costs had been paid. Steve Nielson will thank the Congregation for stepping up the last Sunday of August.

The following items summarize the financial results for the month of July:

Statement of Operations – Income (Page 3):

- Weekly Offerings for July 2024 were \$63 more than the amount budgeted and \$289 less than the amount received for July 2023. There were four Sundays in 2024 but five Sundays 2023. Year to date Weekly Offerings were \$408 less than the amount budgeted but \$523 (\$15 per week) more than the same period in 2023. We also received Special Offerings of \$580 for Energy.
- The only Investment activity for the Operating Fund consisted of \$0.47 in interest to the Money Market Account.
- Year to date Operating Income, comprised of Weekly Offerings plus other Income accounts, is \$956 more than the amount budgeted and \$1,717 more than 2023.

Statement of Operations – Expense (Pages 4-6):

- Total Operating Fund Expenses* for July 2024 were \$2,935 less than the amount budgeted but \$239 more than the Expenses for July 2023. Year to date Expenses were \$10,100 less than budgeted and \$3,770 less than the same period in 2023. Year to date favorability to the Expense budget continues to be driven by open staff positions, a Workers' Comp refund, and lower heating cost, partially offset by higher electricity, office supplies, and administrative expenses.
- There was a loss (Income less Expense) of \$1,114* in July 2024 versus a loss of \$584 in July 2023.

Dedicated Accounts (Page 7):

Dedicated Accounts had income of \$2,398 and expense of \$219 for the month, leaving a balance of \$94,973.

Building Fund (Page 9):

• Hope for the Future offerings received in July 2024 were \$770 which was \$805 less than the amount budgeted and \$460 less than the amount received for July 2023. We have received Memorials of \$1,705 year to date. Final invoices for the parking lot repair totaling \$104,586 were paid to the engineering firm and Hutch paving in July.

Investments (Page 9):

• The securities account had a July gain of \$5,585 compared to a gain of \$6,921 for July 2023. Year to date 2024, the securities account excluding interfund transfers* had a gain of \$32,209 versus a gain of \$32,597 for the 2023.

^{*} NOTE: \$79,238 was transferred from the bank savings account to the money market fund in the Charles Schwab investment account in March. In July, those funds plus additional funds from the investment account were transferred to the bank checking account to pay parking lot repair invoices. The offsetting Interfund transfer entries created in March were reversed in July and are excluded from July analysis so that reasonable comparisons can be made to 2023 figures.

Pastor's Report - Pastor Meg: No report at this time. She will give us both months reports in September.
