
### HOPE CHURCH INFORMATION


# **Christmas Pageant December 15th**


Do you recall the magic of Christmas morning during your childhood?

#### Protect yourself, don't share:

-SSN -Credit/Debit Card numbers

-PIN #'s -Passwords

-Other personal information

#### **ELDER ABUSE**

#### **EXAMPLES OF FINANCIAL EXPLOITATION:**

- -Theft of money or property often by a family member, caregiver, or in-home helper.
- -Tax and debt collection scam.
- -Scams by telemarketers, mail offers or door-to-door salespersons.
- -Lottery and sweepstakes scams.
- -Charity scams.
- -Grandparent/imposter scams.
- -Computer or internet scams.

#### PHISHING ATTACK

- -Do not open any message that comes from an unfamiliar source.
- Do not call the phone number that the caller or spoof website provides you.
- -Do not click on links
- -Delete email/text that ask for personal information
- -If you're concerned about your account or need to reach an organization that you do business with use the contact information on a statement or back of credit/debit card.
- -If you receive an email that looks like friends/family asking for money, CALL them to verify that the email truly came from them.



#### **ROMANCE SCAMS**

A romance scam is when a new love interest says they love you, but they just want your money.

#### **Warning Signs:**

- -Being overly complimentary and flirtatious.
- -Showering you with affection and overwhelming you with texts, emails, and phone calls.
- -Suggesting or insisting that you keep the "relationship" a secret.
- -Pressuring or hurrying you to share your private financial information and being pushy or nosy about your finances.

### ACCOUNT TAKEOVER (ATO)

Account takeover (ATO) is a cybercrime in which someone accesses another person's online account by obtaining their sign-on credentials.

# Best practices for both businesses and individuals:

- -Use multiple passwords
- -Adjust account settings to limit login attempts.
- -Use VPNs to increase privacy & security online
- -Install antivirus software on computers/devices
- -Regularly monitor financial accounts.

#### **GRANDPARENT SCAMS**

Fraudsters exploit the trust and love between grandparents and their grandchild. They often pose as a grandchild or other family member in distress, claiming to be stranded in a foreign location or facing legal trouble.

#### **Red Flags:**

- -Urgency of request
- -Secrecy
- -Using fear tactics to get you to make quick, impulsive decisions.

#### How to Avoid Cell Phone Scams

Gone are the days when we answered the phone every time it rang without knowing who was calling. Now hackers have gotten highly sophisticated in using cell phones to trick and scam users, often to the tune of thousands of dollars. The New York Times has included a number of articles just on this subject recently.

Here are some tips to stay safe on your cell phone:

- Try to keep your contacts list up to date so when the phone rings, your caller ID tells you who is calling so you can decide whether to answer it.
- If the caller is NOT in your contacts list, don't answer it. If it's an important call, they will leave a message, and you can decide whether to call back. Be aware that some scammers create caller IDs that look legitimate but really aren't.
- NEVER, NEVER, give out social security numbers, Medicare numbers, bank account numbers, credit card numbers, etc., to PEOPLE WHO CALL YOU.
- If you do end up on a call with a stranger, hang up immediately if they start the call by asking "Can you hear me?" or want you to press a number to speak with a representative.
- No legitimate business, bank or government agency, including law enforcement, the IRS, the court, phone carriers and utilities, will ask you to pay a bill specifically with gift cards, wire transfer/Western Union, payment apps or cryptocurrency. They also will not call to ask for sensitive information like your social security number, driver's license ID or other account numbers.
  If you do receive a stressful call and are unsure of what to do, STOP, hang up, and touch base with a friend, a family member, a financial advisor, a church friend or the like.

According to the Federal Trade Commission, typical types of scams include: Impersonator scams pretending to be a family member, a government agency, law enforcement, court official, love interest.

Debt relief and credit repair scams offering to lower your interest rate.

Investment scams guaranteeing big profits.

Charity scams asking for donations.

Extended car warranties scams from hackers who might know the make and model of your car to sound legitimate.

Free trial scams that end up billing you until you figure out how to cancel.

Loan scams with an upfront fee.

Lottery/prize scams where you're asked to pay taxes or fees to receive your "prize." From the FTC: Scammers PRESSURE you to act immediately.

Scammers want you to act before you have time to think. While you're on the phone, they might tell you not to hang up so you can't check out their story. They might threaten to arrest you, sue you, take away your driver's or business license, or deport you. They might say your computer is about to be corrupted.

Just Hang Up - you do not need to speak to them or even be polite.

The Operating Fund had a loss of \$16,824 for the first nine months of 2024, compared to a loss of \$23,042 for the same period of 2023. Total Operating Income of \$163,406 was \$6,785 more than the same period last year. Total Operating Fund Expenses of \$180,230 were \$567 more than 2023.

In the first nine months of 2024, we received Special Offerings of \$1,732 for Easter, \$10 for Christmas, \$2,105 for Energy, \$680 for Church Growth and \$140 in Other Offerings. Mission Offerings for the period included OCWM - \$540, One Great Hour of Sharing - \$765, Christmas Fund - \$10, and CUE/Olivet \$385.


Year to date September 2024, the Building Fund had total Income of \$60,093, including a \$41,914 gain on the Investment account. Invoices totaling \$107,456 were paid in 2024 for the parking lot repair which was completed in July.

During the first three quarters of 2024, Dedicated Accounts received \$12,924 (Good Samaritan \$455, Blessing Bags – Covenant House \$760, CMWC Projects \$2,172, Food Pantry \$7,945, Special Gifts to Church School \$250, Ukraine Relief \$200, UCC Assoc Grants \$500 and a \$642 transfer to combine Endowment Funds) and had expenses of \$12,285 (Good Samaritan \$843, Blessing Bags – Covenant House \$760, Food Pantry \$6,354, Special Gifts to Church School \$1,050, Ukraine Relief \$200, UCC Metro Association Grants - \$353 and Endowment Funds transfer to combine line items plus purchase of new office computer \$2,725).

### Hope United Church of Christ Synopsis of Board Meeting October 8, 2024

The meeting was called to order at 7:03 p.m. by President Steve Nielson. Pastor Meg led us in prayer. Those in

attendance: Pastor Meg, Steve Nielson, Nancy Burnham, Terri Hillman, Kirk Schoenherr, Linda Parsons, Linda Rehm, Lori Sarnowski and Nancy Fay. Absent: Jerry Rogers. Guest during New Business – Matt Skubik.

Congregational Comments - Steve Nielson - None

Additions to the Agenda – Steve Nielson – Sunshine Person to be presented by Nancy Fay. This idea will go to Spritual Council first.

Approval of Agenda – Motion to approve the agenda as amended was made by Nancy Fay with a second by Lori Sarnowski. Motion carried.

President's Remarks – Steve Nielson: Keep in the back of your mind a person for leading the Nominating Committee. We will need five people for the Board next year.

Approval of the September Meeting Minutes – Motion by Linda Rehm with a second by Nancy Burnham to approve the September minutes. Motion Carried.

Treasurer's Report for September 2024 – Motion was made by Nancy Burnham with a second by Kirk Schoenherr to approve the report for September. Motion Carried.

The following items summarize the financial results for the month of September: Statement of Operations – Income (Page 3):

- Weekly Offerings for September 2024 were \$3,019 more than the amount budgeted and \$6,131 more than the amount received for September 2023. There were four September Sundays in 2023 and five Sundays in 2024. Year to date Weekly Offerings were \$453 more than the amount budgeted and \$5,795 (\$135 per week) more than the same period in 2023. We also received Special Offerings of \$100 for Energy and \$355 for C.U.E/Olivet in September.
- The only Investment activity for the Operating Fund consisted of \$0.45 in interest to the Money Market Account.
- Year to date Operating Income, comprised of Weekly Offerings plus other Income accounts, is \$2,005 more than the amount budgeted and \$6,785 more than 2023.

Statement of Operations - Expense (Pages 4-6):

- Total Operating Fund Expenses for September 2024 were \$2,042 more than the amount budgeted and \$3,313 more than the
  Expenses for September 2023. Year to date Expenses were \$9,226 less than budgeted but \$567 more than the same period
  in 2023. Year to date favorability to the Expense budget is primarily driven by the open Christian Education Director position
  and associated Christian Education costs, as well as lower heating cost. That favorability is partially offset by higher electricity
  and grounds upkeep costs, office supplies and administrative expenses, and cost associated with increased church life
  activities.
- There was a loss (Income less Expense) of \$4,054 in September 2024 versus a loss of \$6,964 September 2023.

#### Dedicated Accounts (Page 7):

Dedicated Accounts had income of \$888 and expense of \$671 for the month, leaving a balance of \$97,134.

#### Building Fund (Page 9):

Hope for the Future offerings received in September 2024 were \$1,545 which was \$145 more than the amount budgeted and \$220 more than the amount received for September 2023. We have received Memorials of \$3,025 year to date. Final invoices for the parking lot repair were paid in July bringing the total paid in 2024 for the repair to \$107,456.

#### Investments (Page 9):

 The securities account had a September gain of \$4,806 compared to a loss of \$9,522 for September 2023. Year to date 2024, the securities account had a gain of \$41,914 versus a gain of \$19,180 for the 2023.


