

<u>How do Service Dogs Help with Recovery From PTSD Or Addiction?</u>


The dogs that we assign at Warriors Heart are specifically trained to be service dogs. They have been conditioned to be attuned to their handler's needs. As they learn the individual personality of their partner warrior in our program, they become better at providing much-needed support during the recovery process. Service Dog training continues for the life of the animal and strengthens as the team continues to work together.

Here are some ways service dogs provide support:

- Smell oncoming episodes of anxiety. All humans give off nearly imperceptible signals when they experience stress, and the Service Dog can often begin to detect the chemical reactions going on within the body associated with anxiety. The dog can be trained to continually touch its handler at the very beginning stages of anxiety.
- Reorient and "ground" the handler to a safe environment when struggling with PTSD episodes. Sometimes, all a PTSD victim needs is a presence to guide them back to reality. Service dogs can intervene and refocus their handlers in times of stress.
- Remind the handler to perform her or his daily routines
- Reduce fear associated with meeting new people or social settings
- Assist handler in creating a safe personal space
- Serve as a buffer to calm handler and reduce feelings of emotional distress in crowded places

Hanging a birdhouse in your yard is an easy way to help protect the birds in your neighborhood on chilly days. What's the best place to put it? "Safety should be the main priority," says Robyn Shepherd of the National Audubon Society. "Place birdhouses away from windows to avoid collisions, and out of reach of animals like squirrels and raccoons." It's also smart to keep it near greenery where birds can hide. If you buy a new birdhouse, avoid models with a perch, she says. "Perches make it easier for predators to access the house."

Create a Bird-Friendly Community:

Healthy Birds will be better equipped to face the challenges of a warming world. Commit to creating safe spaces for birds in your home and community by using fewer pesticides, letting dead trees stand, installing birdbaths, and converting lawns and gardens to native plants. School grounds, parks, vacant lots, and common areas can all be "bird-scaped," too.













Volunteers are greatly needed to help frail, older and disabled adults in our community with:



Meeting Minutes from March 11, 2025 Board of Trustees Hope United Church of Christ

The meeting was called to order at 7:06 p.m. by President Kirk Schoenherr. Pastor Meg led us in prayer.

Those in attendance Brad Lusk, Carissa Spear, Cynthia Greening, Kirk Schoenherr, Pastor Meg, Rick Cole, Nancy Fay, Terri Hillman, Jim Wilson Absent: Nancy Burnham,

Congregational Comments - None

Additions to the Agenda - None

Approval of Agenda - Motion to approve the agenda was made by Rick with a second by Cindy. Motion carried.

President's Remarks - Kirk Schoenherr - welcome everyone new and experienced veterans. Please be patient 😊. Go around room and get a quick overview of what people have done for employment and special interests or skill sets:

 Cindy: retired - executive project manager. Has held roles as secretary and president in other organizations

• Carissa: Mclaren Healthcare – analyzes data, problem solving

• Terri, retired finance and accounting, CPA. Certified auditor. Investor relations at a public utility.

• Jim: Marketing and Technology

• Brad: working in sales leading a team covering SW Michigan.

Rick: Industrial sales and engineering. Sales and Marketing
Nancy Fay: Teacher for many years. Started her own company at 50YO. Selling odds and ends and has been on almost every committee in UCC *
• Kirk: Retired. GM at Taco Bell. Broad HR background and broad team leadership. Main

interest is helping people.

Pastor Meg: Counseling and working in agencies that served families in crisis. Has worked for a Church in some capacity since she was 20. Passion for children and youth

Approval of the February Meeting Minutes - Motion was made by Jim with a second by Rick to approve the February meeting minutes. Motion Carried.

Treasurer's Reports for February 2025 – Terri Hillman – Motion was made by Nancy F with a second by Rick to approve the February report. Motion Carried.

The following items summarize the financial results for the month of February:

Statement of Operations – Income (Page 3):

- Weekly Offerings for February 2025 were \$2,795 less than the amount budgeted and \$3,928 (\$336 per week) less than the amount received for February 2024. There were four February Sundays in both years, but there was no inperson worship service on February 16, 2025, due to inclement weather. Year to date Weekly Offerings were \$2,770 less than budget and \$3,028 less than the same period in 2024. We also received Special Offerings of \$189 for Energy, \$170 for Our Church's Wider Mission, and \$50 for One Great Hour of Sharing.
- The only Investment activity for the Operating Fund consisted of \$52.97 in interest to the Money Market Savings Account at First State Bank. That account paid an annual percentage rate of 3.83% in February of 2025 versus a rate of 0.05% in 2024. \$20,000 was transferred from Checking to Savings in February to take advantage of the increased 2025 interest rate. The interest rate and account balances will be monitored monthly to determine if working capital

needs will allow additional funds to be transferred to Savings.

 Year to date Operating Income, comprised of Weekly Offerings plus other Income accounts, is \$2,441 less than the amount budgeted and \$2,193 less than 2024.

Statement of Operations - Expense (Pages 4-6):

- Total Operating Fund Expenses for February 2025 were \$3,610 more than the amount budgeted and \$2,758 more
 than the Expenses for February 2024. Year to date Expenses were \$3,492 more than budget and \$4,230 more than
 2024. The year-to-date variances to budget and 2024 were caused primarily by higher Grounds Upkeep cost due to
 inclement weather in 2025, higher electricity cost, a 2024 premium audit adjustment for Workers Compensation billed
 in 2025, timing of Technology purchases of new headphones for the soundboard and a new webcam, and additional
 expenses for Christian Education as more children consistently attend services.
- There was a loss (Income less Expense) of \$8,659 in February 2025 versus a loss of \$1,757 in February 2024.

Dedicated Accounts (Page 7):

Dedicated Accounts had income of \$1,467 and expense of \$3,392 for the month, leaving a balance of \$100,597.

Building Fund (Page 9):

 Hope for the Future offerings received in February were \$855 which was \$720 less than the amount budgeted and \$105 less than the amount received for February 2024. Hope for the Future year to date offerings were \$2,110 which was \$1,040 less than budget but \$280 more than the same period in 2024. We have received Memorials of \$1,737 year to date.

Investments (Page 9):

The securities account had a February loss of \$1,935 compared to a gain of \$9,178 for February 2024.

- Meg mentions that there is a timing issue on purchasing supplies for various programs as we purchase goods in advance of programming.
- Also a corrected journal entry was made to reconcile the 2024 annual accounts.
- Terri commented that some of those who make donations direct from 401k accounts may be timing withdrawals due to market volatility

Long discussion on the next pledge campaign. Discussion around the importance of having commitments that we can use to budget around. Suggestion that perhaps a good approach would be to ask for a minimum commitment.

Unfinished Business - Kirk Schoenherr

1. Painting Improvements .. we need to think about painting in the sanctuary. The property committee is planning on some activity near the sound-board together with drywall around window.

New Business

- 2. Organ Update Kirk Organ is working. Repairs have been made, but not all the repairs could be made. Parts may no longer be available. There are multiple issues. Agreed to think about this for a month and then form a task force to dive into options.
- 3. Monthly Events Update Kirk -

• Chilli cook off is on 3/16 following worship.

- On 3/28 there is a Panera bread fund raiser for CMWC from 4-8pm and Motor City Chorale at 7pm
- Also on 3/28, Celebrating your life workshop at 1:00pm
- 4. Installation of New Board Kirk requesting 3/30 tentatively
- 5. Funding for Musicians for Easter Service Pastor Meg Need/Would like a trumpeter for Easter / Christmas services prices is estimated to be \$250 for one rehearsal and a service performance. Funding Options:
 - A couple of places where we could get \$50-\$100 from budgets
