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WORDS OF HOPE



"I know that it is well with your soul." 3 John 1:2

How is it with your soul today? What a meaningful way of asking someone how they are doing. Perhaps, we would get a more honest answer instead of the obligatory response of, "I'm fine", if we asked this question instead of how are you. Certainly, during these winter months and during a time of uneasiness our souls have gotten a workout.

John Wesley used the question how is it with your soul two centuries ago when he developed a new way for Christians to support each other in the faith. His followers met in "class meetings," which we now call small groups. The groups focused on the spiritual disciplines of prayer, support, study and accountability. It was the 18th century version of a small support group.

It was also a profound way to help people grow in their relationship with God. Imagine if you asked yourself or someone close to you, "How is it with your soul?" We measure our lives in all kinds of ways- the hours we work, the salary we earn, the success of our children, the home we live in, the time we spend exercising. Corporations and other organizations focus on "best practices" or "quality control" to measure their success.

But how do we assess the *most* important relationship of our lives, our relationship with God? John Wesley's question based on the scripture from the Third Letter of John, is a good place to start.

During this season of Lent, ask yourself, how is it with my soul today? Your mind may be filled with lists of things to do or problems to solve. Your heart may be overflowing with joy or breaking with sadness and grief. But how is it with your soul? Whatever the day may bring or has brought, how are you experiencing God in this time?

How can you deepen this soul-searching experience? You might find that reading a Lenten daily devotion or listen to music reminds you of God's love. I invite you to join us for worship or our Lenten study. Plan to attend our Celebrating Your Life Workshop. You can contribute to your Lenten Blessing Bag or in our Removing the Clutter Project.

This season is the perfect time to commit to worshipping or serving others. Please pray for Hope Church and for those in need. Take time during the 40 days of Lent, this season of preparation, to reflect on the state of your soul. So, I ask, "How is it with your soul this day?"

"You Can't Ask That!: 50 Taboo Questions about the Bible, Jesus, and Christianity"



What is Lent? Why do we observe it in 2025?

Lent is a special season in the church! Lent is a time to prepare for Easter. The liturgical color for Lent is purple.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday. It lasts 40 days, not counting Sundays. Lent ends at sunset the night before Easter Sunday. Sundays are considered "little Easters".

The ashes for Ash Wednesday are from the palm branches from the previous Palm Sunday. Why do we do Ashes, isn't that a Roman Catholic tradition? Protestants used ashes too. We use the ashes as a tangible reminder of our own mortality and a call to repent from those things that separate us from God. Starting on Ash Wednesday and throughout Lent, we acknowledge our dependence upon God and God's unending love for us.

The word "Lent" comes from an Old English word lencten, which refers to there being more hours of daylight and the season of spring. Lent is not mentioned in the Bible. However, it is a biblical tradition to have a time of preparation before every important religious celebration.

Lent is a time to examine our thoughts, feelings and actions to help us to find ways to grow in our faith. Lent is a time to renew our commitment to God.

During Lent, we remember the life of Jesus. We remember that Jesus taught us to love and forgive one another.

Some people give things up during Lent, like sweets or a favorite activity as a way of honoring God. It is also a time of letting go of behaviors that have taken on too much importance. Examples might be spending too much time on social media or behaviors that impact us negatively like gossiping.

The early church taught that giving up something was a way to recall the great sacrifice that Christ made for all people. More recently people add on extra activities, like reading their Bible, participating in a study or finding additional ways to help people. Adding an intentional spiritual practice is a healthy way of growing and following the teachings of Jesus.

AMBASSADOR FOR HOPE: JOB DESCRIPTION

The purpose of this designated role is to have at least two people each week to serve as friendly greeters. We want to make sure that visitors and our members feel welcome at Hope. We would try to have 8 people serving in this official capacity. Ambassadors would sign up for a week each month but also be available as needed.

Weekly responsibility:

- *Be at church by 9:45.
- *Wear a nametag with yellow ambassador sticker
- *Watch for newcomers and introduce yourself. Answer questions and invite them to sit with you.
- *During worship scan the sanctuary looking for new faces.
- *During the blessing song walk out and stand near Pastor Meg.
- *Introduce yourself to new people.

- *Invite them to coffee hour and go with them if possible. Sit with them and find a table with other members you can introduce them to.
- *Offer a tour of the church building.

CHRISTIAN MISSION & WITNESS

The CMWC is still looking for people who might be interested in some pantry-related activities at times other than pantry day.

1. We need people to help pack boxes in-between pantry days. There is some lifting needed, 35lbs boxes. If you cannot lift, you could help fill boxes with dry goods which doesn't require lifting. The time commitment for this

task would be 1 - 1.5 hours per packing party once a month.

2. We need folks to help us with bottle returns once a month on Monday mornings at 9:30 am. The time commitment for this task would be 1-1 1/2 hours. There is some lifting needed to take the bags of bottles out of the trailer, and put them in a shopping cart. Can't lift? No problem. Someone will help you. The \$\$ we receive from the returnables goes to support our food pantry.

3. We need some men/young adults to help unload food from a vehicle and bring it in to the church on the Friday before pantry and on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays of the month. The time commitment for this task varies depending upon traffic and waiting time at Gleaners or Macomb Food

Bank.

4. The CMWC is also looking for people to join our committee. You know about our work with the pantry. We support other outreach projects as well. The time commitment for membership on the Committee is a 2-hour meeting once a month on the Tuesday before pantry. Additional time will be needed if you wish to participate in any of our outreach projects.

Five Ways Warriors Heart's K-9 Program Helps Warriors Heal

1. Gives warriors a sense of "hope and healing" during their 42-day in-patient treatmentthey can see a "future" by being trained to adopt a service dog to take home.

2. Gives warriors a sense of purpose by caring for a service dog—who is often a rescue dog with wounds, so they are healing each other.

3. Provides warriors with daily physical activity and a routine—that replaces bad

habits with good habits, major part of recovery.

- 4. Gives warriors comfort during difficult times: Warriors Heart's K9s are custom trained based on the individual's needs to mitigate PTS symptoms, panic attacks, Tourette's Syndrome ticks, seizures, nightmares, social anxieties, dissociation, lower-level anxieties and more.
- 5. Provides life-saving companionship when the warrior leaves treatment, especially for those who may be living in isolation—K9 therapy and training also continues when they go home.



The cost is just \$1 per person, per class.




COMMUNITY



Hope United Church of Christ Synopsis of Board Meeting February 11, 2025

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by President Steve Nielson. Pastor Meg led us in prayer.

Those in attendance: Pastor Meg, Steve Nielson, Lori Sarnowski, Terri Hillman, Kirk Schoenherr, Linda Parsons, Linda Rehm and Nany Fay. Absent: Jerry Rogers and Nancy Burnham.

Congregational Comments – Steve Nielson – None

Additions to the Agenda - Steve Nielson - None

Approval of Agenda – Motion to approve the agenda was made by Terri Hillman with a second by Nancy Fay. Motion carried.

President's Remarks – Steve Nielson – It has been a very successful year of 2024 both with events and financially. Thank you to the current Board for all of their support. It was a great shower for Baby Jesus. I wish the new board success.

Approval of the January Meeting Minutes – Motion was made by Lori Sarnowski with a second by Kirk Schoenherr to approve the January meeting minutes. Motion Carried.

Treasurer's Reports for January 2025 – Terri Hillman - Motion was made by Linda Rehm with a second by Kirk Schoenherr to approve the January Report. Motion Carried.

The following items summarize the financial results for the month of January:

Statement of Operations - Income (Page 3):

- Weekly Offerings for January 2025 were \$25 more than the amount budgeted and \$901 (\$225 per week) more than the
 amount received for January 2024. There were four January Sundays in both years. We also received Special Offerings
 of \$1,160 for Energy (including a \$600 stipend from The Emergency Food Assistance Program to partially offset expenses
 of running the Food Pantry) and \$20 for the Christmas Fund.
- The only Investment activity for the Operating Fund consisted of \$30.74 in interest to the Money Market Account at First State Bank.
- Year to date Operating Income, comprised of Weekly Offerings plus other Income accounts, is \$786 more than the amount budgeted and \$1,951 more than 2024.

Statement of Operations - Expense (Pages 4-6):

- Total Operating Fund Expenses for January 2025 were \$118 less than the amount budgeted but \$1,471 more than the
 Expenses for January 2024. The year-over-year Expense difference was primarily due to increased Grounds Upkeep
 costs for more snow removal and salting in 2025.
- There was a loss (Income less Expense) of \$3,115 in January 2025 versus a loss of \$3,595 in January 2024.

Dedicated Accounts (Page 7):

Dedicated Accounts had income of \$1,835 and expense of \$1,549 for the month, leaving a balance of \$102,522.

Building Fund (Page 9):

 Hope for the Future offerings received in January 2025 were \$1,255 which was \$320 less than the amount budgeted but \$385 more than the amount received for January 2024. We received Memorials of \$1,427 in January.

Investments (Page 9):

The securities account had a January gain of \$7,771 compared to a gain of \$2,167 for January 2024.

New Business

Annual Meeting Update – Steve Nielson: The Annual Meeting will be held Sunday, February 23, 2025 at 11:15 am in Fellowship Hall and will be in-person only. We will need two people to sign in members. Linda Rehm volunteered and Steve will get one other person from the Congregation. Pastor Meg requested that Nancy Fay lead us in song if there was a need due to a vote having to take place due to additional candidates from the floor. Steve will request Gail to make sign-in sheets and have ballots available if they are needed.

Housing Resolution – Terri Hillman: Linda Parsons had noticed it was not part of the January Board Meeting as had been done in the past. She had noticed its absence when typing the January minutes and comparing them to the prior January minutes. There is no change for 2025. Therefore, the Board decided it will be revisited at the time the Budget for the following year is being prepared unless the Pastor needed it addressed earlier.

Insurance Update – Steve Nielson: Hartford Insurance requires all vendors who provide services at Hope Church to have Worker's Compensation Insurance. Hartford informed us not to allow our current company on our property without having a Worker's Compensation Policy. Due to an ice storm coming, we had a different Snow Removal Company provide salting services as they had a Worker's Compensation Policy and our current provider did not. Our current provider subsequently got a Worker's Compensation Policy and will now be charging us \$25 more per month to help him pay for his policy.

We also have need for an organ repair and organ repair people are normally sole-proprietors and carry liability insurance but do not carry Worker's Compensation on themselves. Pastor Meg suggested we contact the UCC Legal Department and see what they have to say about this situation. Lenten Season Update – Pastor Meg: A study of the Book "You Can't Ask That!: 50 Taboo Questions about the Bible, Jesus, and Christianity". Copies of the book will be available for purchase at \$12 each and Hope Church will start a hybrid book study both on zoom and in person on March 12th for five consecutive Wednesdays at 7 pm. 
