




What truly distinguishes this exercise class is *YOU*. All you need to do is *SHOW UP* for an hour filled with fun and fitness alongside friends!

The emphasis on participant engagement ensures an enjoyable experience, with a modest fee of only \$1 per class.






Prayer is at the heart of our connection with God.

TREASURERS REPORT

*MOTION TO ACCEPT APRIL TREASURER'S REPORT Cindy/Nancy – Motion Approved

Overview

- Not particularly meaningful to compare to last year.
- Have moved more money to First state to earn 4% on Balance.
- YTD Offerings ~2900> budget
- YTD Expenses~5800>budget, driven by timing on many things (but not over for year)
- Grounds upkeep is the biggest expense over budget.

The following items summarize the financial results for the month of May:

Statement of Operations - Income (Page 3):

- Weekly Offerings for May 2025 were \$2,530 more than the amount budgeted and \$5,228 more than the amount received for May 2024. There were four May Sundays in both years. Year to date Weekly Offerings were \$1,658 more than budget and \$9,555 (\$398 per week average) more than the same period in 2024. We also received Special Offerings of \$225 for Easter, \$140 for Energy, and \$320 for Church Growth.
- The only Investment activity for the Operating Fund consisted of \$109 in interest to the Money Market Savings Account at First State Bank. The account paid an annual percentage rate of 4.0% in May of 2025 versus a rate of 0.05% in 2024.
- Year to date Operating Income of \$95,328, comprised of Weekly Offerings plus other Income accounts, is \$2,925 more than the amount budgeted and \$10,704 more than 2024.

Statement of Operations - Expense (Pages 4-6):

- Total Operating Fund Expenses for May 2025 were \$1,322 more than the amount budgeted and \$2,162 more than the Expenses for May 2024. May Expenses were higher than Budget and 2024 primarily due to timing of costs such as Spiritual Council, Christian Education, and Coffee Hour supplies, as well purchases of new amplifying, telephone, and power supply equipment. Year to date Expenses were \$5,847 more than budget, driven by similar timing differences as well as much higher Grounds Upkeep cost than expected. Year to date Expenses were \$12,994 (adjusted for intercompany transfers) more than 2024 due to higher 2025 utilities and Grounds Upkeep costs, a large workers compensation credit in 2024 partially offset by a premium audit adjustment billed in 2025, an increase in 2025 multi-peril insurance premiums, and less labor cost in 2024 due to open staff positions.
- There was a loss (Income less Expense) of \$188 in May 2025 versus a loss of \$3,616 in May 2024.
