WORDS OF HOPE



In July we celebrated our ten years in ministry together here at Hope Church. I treasure our relationships and the faces of the faithful I see each week. I also delight in the number of people who have joined our community of faith more recently. Some of our newer members and visitors are just learning about the United Church of Christ.

When I think about people hearing our story it makes me profoundly thankful for the United Church of Christ and the priorities we hold. I am grateful that we are ready to respond with open arms to any child of God that comes through our doors. There is no test, there is no requirement to receive Holy Communion. We trust that the sacrament is a holy mystery and that those who receive it will be exposed to Christ's love.

The same is true with Baptism. We baptize children and adults. As a pastor, I meet with families and individuals, and we discuss the deep connection made through baptism. We dispel some of the harmful myths people may have previously been exposed to.

On the other end of the spectrum, our seniors are an active and dynamic group within our church.

The UCC has a proud history of speaking out on social issues. We value being a safe and welcoming church for all people. At Hope, we serve those in need through our food pantry and other mission programs. The UCC states; "to care is to do". Our support of the Greater UCC provides emergency and ongoing aid through local, national and global ministries. We care about the planet. We work to recycle and reduce and reuse within the church. We are mindful of our individual and communal responsibility.

We offer a safe space within the community. We open our doors to groups like AA, PFLAG and OA. We recognize that on life's journey there are people within our community who need an encouraging word.

Finally, we celebrate diversity. We don't need to share the exact same opinions. God created us to be thinking and caring people not identical robots. We treat each other with respect, and we work together to serve others.

I celebrate that within the UCC we are continually seeking to become the people God is calling us to be. The General Synod of the UCC met this summer and there were lively discussions about how to help the church to thrive. Let us celebrate those things we do well and look for ways to move forward in Jesus' name.

Hearing Assistance is Offered at Hope UCC


Are you having trouble hearing Pastor Meg's sermon? Do you feel the choir could sing a bit louder? We're here to help!

Saturday, August 9th from 10 a.m. - 12 p.m.



Using native plants in your yard creates a beautiful, low-maintenance, and inexpensive landscape. Choosing to use native plants benefits you and the environment!

Why Use Native Plants?

What Are Native Plants?

Native plants are trees, grasses, shrubs and flowers that have evolved over thousands of years in a particular region. They have become well-adapted to the physical features and climate of the area. 




FAMILY PAGE

The Operating Fund had a loss of \$15,780 for the first six months of 2025. This compares to a loss of \$8,467 (adjusted for 2024 intercompany transfers) for the first six months of 2024. Total Operating Income of \$118,772 was \$6,603 more than the same period last year. Total Operating Fund Expenses of \$134,552 were \$13,915 more than the same period last year. The second quarter Expense variance to 2024 was driven primarily by higher utilities and Grounds Upkeep costs, a large workers compensation credit in 2024 partially offset by a premium audit adjustment billed in 2025, an increase in 2025 multi-peril insurance premiums, and increased staff labor cost in 2025.

Operating Fund Regular Offerings of \$108,836 were \$6,485 more than the same period of last year. In the first six months of 2025, we also received Special Offerings of \$1,475 for Easter, \$2,304 for Energy and \$490 for Church Growth. Mission Offerings for the period included OCWM - \$490, One Great Hour of Sharing - \$615, Neighbors in Need - \$75, and Christmas Fund - \$20.

In the second quarter of 2025, the Building Fund had Total Income of \$33,881. Hope for the Future (Regular) Offerings of \$8,255 were \$319 less than the amount received for the same period last year. 2025 Special Offering Memorials of \$6,416 were \$4,931 more than the same period in 2024. There was a 2025 Investment account gain of \$19,210 versus a gain of \$29,824 during the same period of 2024. Building Fund Expenses (adjusted for 2024 intercompany transfers) were \$6,730 more than the same period of 2024 due to a planned and budgeted power washing of the building in June 2025.

During the first six months of 2025, Dedicated Accounts received \$6,241 (Good Samaritan \$625, Blessing Bags \$839, Food Pantry \$11,243, Music \$500, Technology \$250, and Special Gifts to Church School \$662) and had expenses of \$15,414 (Good Samaritan \$535, Blessing Bags \$839, Senior Youth Group \$262, CMWC Projects \$366, Food Pantry \$8,005, Music \$250, Special Gifts to Church School \$660, UCC Detroit Metro Grants \$47, and Endowment \$4,450). The \$4,450 cost for repairing damaged drywall and painting the sanctuary was charged to the Endowment Fund in May as approved by the Board of Trustees.

Statement of Operations - Income (Page 3):

- Weekly Offerings for June 2025 were \$5,637 more than the amount budgeted but \$3,700 less than the amount received for June 2024. There were five June Sundays in both years. Year to date Weekly Offerings were \$7,385 more than budget and \$5,856 (\$202 per week average) more than the same period in 2024. We also received Special Offerings of \$250 for Easter, \$100 for Energy, and \$120 for Church Growth.
- The only Investment activity for the Operating Fund consisted of \$120 in interest to the Money Market Savings Account at First State Bank. The account paid an annual percentage rate of 4.0% in June of 2025 versus a rate of 0.05% in 2024.
- Year to date Operating Income of \$118,772, comprised of Weekly Offerings plus other Income accounts, is \$8,882 more than the amount budgeted and \$6,603 more than 2024.

Statement of Operations – Expense (Pages 4-6):

- Total Operating Fund Expenses for June 2025 were \$168 more than the amount budgeted and \$921 more than the
 Expenses for June 2024. Year to date Expenses were \$6,015 more than budget, driven by various timing differences as
 well as higher Grounds Upkeep, Insurance, and On-Line Donation costs. Year to date Expenses were \$13,915 (adjusted
 for intercompany transfers) more than 2024 primarily due to higher 2025 utilities and Grounds Upkeep costs, a large
 workers compensation credit in 2024 partially offset by a premium audit adjustment billed in 2025, an increase in 2025
 multi-peril insurance premiums, and increased staff labor cost in 2025.
- There was income (Income less Expense) of \$266 in June 2025 versus income of \$5,288 in June 2024.

- There was an article in the Beacon summarizing our current safety procedures. The church doors need to be consistently locked after worship begins and during
- coffee hour. In an emergency we would contact Clinton Township not Fraser Police Department. We would need to be clear with police dispatcher. We discussed the Sunday School wing and potential safety procedures including walkie-talkies and special door locks. We might want to ask local school districts for input on safety in the classroom.
- It was suggested that Hope Church host a Self Defense Class for the community.
- We have an AED defibrillator on the wall in the lobby. Pam Steffens is willing to do a training for us. We need to make members aware of the location and purpose of the AED.
- √Power Washing North side retaining wall/Kirk. The company that power-washed and sealed the church building power washed the retaining wall along the parking lot for free. They could do the northside retaining wall for a cost of \$300. After discussion there was a motion made to not spend the funds at this time. The motion was made and carried. Nancy F/ Nancy B Carried
- √August BOT Meeting/Kirk Motion to skip August BOT meeting Cindy / Nancy B. Carried

√PASTORS REPORT

Worship: Since our last meeting we celebrated Father's Day, Music Appreciation, Graduation and our Sunday School teachers. This summer I am adding some contemporary music videos to worship.

Church Business: I have been in frequent contact with Matt Skubik at Religious Real Estate and the Harrison's backed out of the lease. Matt said this was very unusual and that we should not have a problem in the future with potential renters. I asked him to please actively market our space. I have been in contact with the Clinton Township Police regarding a safety assessment.

Spiritual Council: We left the Pentecost decorations up for 3 weeks. We celebrated Father's Day and our Graduates.

Christian Education: We can submit the Conference Mitten grant application in the end of July. The grant requirements are very specific for receiving funds for family ministry.
